- Table numbers remain the same as in last year's CD.
- Several changes have been made to all estimates going back historically. All estimates have been adjusted to reflect 2001 Census population counts. Also industry estimates have been classified to the 2002 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) from the 1997 NAICS and occupation estimates have been classified to the National Occupational Classification for Statistics 2001 (NOC-S) from the Standard Occupation Classification of 1991. Lastly, CMA boundaries are now based on 2001 Census boundaries. New CMA maps are provided in the CD (under the LFS Documentation button). The article titled *Improvements in 2005 to the LFS* (also under the LFS Documentation button) provides an overview of the effect of these changes on the estimates.
- A new monthly seasonally adjusted series has been added to CD1T47sa: labour force characteristics by province and sex for the age group 25 to 54 years.
- Annual labour force characteristics can now be retrieved from CD1T35 for 44 cities, eleven of which are new.
- Estimates on labour force characteristics are now available for the Yukon Territory and Northwest Territories in CD1T30. The three-month moving averages and annual estimates for Yukon begin in 1992 and Northwest Territories in 2001, and are not included in the Canada totals.
